- Printer for coloring pages (or create your own, you just need a piece of paper and an imagination).

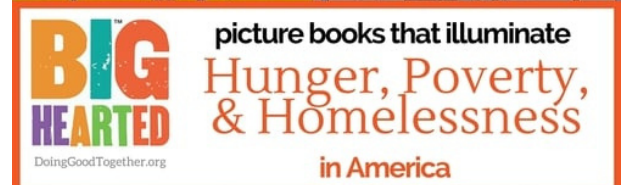
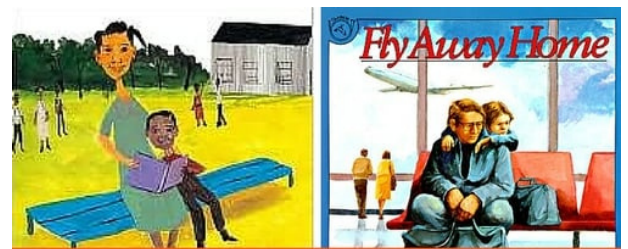
