### The Village Visits the Vice President's House!

The Senate Spouse Organization selected N Street Village for a service project as part of a December event hosted by Second Gentleman Doug Emhoff at the Vice President's residence. Spouses of both Democrat



and Republican lawmakers came together and packed nearly 300 toiletry kits for women living at our emergency shelters.

"The items that we are packing today will bring hope and healing for women in need," Emhoff said. "So this holiday season, like all holiday seasons, let's be kind to each other, let's give back, and let's have a great holiday."

Kenyatta T. Brunson, former president and CEO, joined the Second Gentleman in thanking the attendees for their participation.

"What an honor it is for N Street Village to be selected for this very special service project," she

said. "The kits you are creating today include essential items necessary for everyday care—items we often take for granted—but these toiletries will allow women in our emergency shelters to maintain good physical and mental health."

N Street Village alum and volunteer Carlita Walker (pictured outside the residence) shared her story of healing after arriving at the Village in 2007 and her dedication to giving back to the community.

"I continue to support N Street Village because it makes such a significant difference in my life and the lives of women in crisis," she said.
