### A NEW CHAPTER FOR PAT HANDY

N Street Village operates vital housing programs in seven different locations across Washington, DC. One of the cornerstones of our work is the Patricia Handy Place for Women

(PHPW), a 24-hour, trauma-informed emergency shelter. Three years ago, we moved PHPW to a temporary space to allow for much-needed renovations to the original building.

We are excited to announce that Patricia Handy Place for Women has returned to its original location at 810 5th Street, NW.



This is a major milestone for us, and it's more than just a return to a physical space—it's about deepening our commitment to providing holistic services. Along with our low-barrier emergency shelter, we're placing a stronger emphasis on supporting seniors and offering employment and vocational transitional housing.

The renovation has transformed the building in ways that will directly benefit our clients. With 162 beds, the newly renovated space now includes an updated HVAC system, fresh paint, a waterproofed foundation, enhanced access and security features, and an upgraded elevator. Every detail was carefully considered to make this a safer, more supportive environment for the women we serve.

The Patricia Handy Place for Women is named in honor of the late Patricia Handy, who dedicated her career to improving the lives of DC residents experiencing homelessness.

Dear N Street Village Community,

As we walk together, working to uplift and empower unhoused women in our community, I want to express my deepest gratitude for your support and your ongoing engagement. Even during these times of great uncertainty, the Village remains steadfast in its commitment to building on our rich legacy. For more than fifty years, hope and healing have been at the heart of our mission—and that has not changed.

On the coldest nights, we share the warmth of our community with every meal served, every bed offered, and every moment of support we provide.

As we await the results of the 2025 Point-in-Time Count, I am reminded of the essential role our work plays in addressing the unique barriers women face in achieving housing stability and the support we can provide them on their journey to healing and independence. In the coming months and years, we are committed to enhancing our impact by investing in three key initiatives. First, we are enhancing our capacity to provide geriatric-focused care to meet the needs of an aging homeless population. Second, we are addressing mental health as a root cause of homelessness through the launch of our in-house behavioral health services program. Third, we are expanding our functional literacy support, with an emphasis on health and financial literacy. These key areas are all interrelated and part of an important ecosystem of care we provide, partnering with women and helping to transform lives.

We have a rich history at N Street Village, and we will continue to advance our work to ensure our supportive care reflects the evolving needs of the women we serve. Thank you again for being a vital part of our community and for helping us create brighter days for every woman who walks through our doors.


The Village was honored to host

# EMERGENCY RESOURCES FOR FRIGID WEATHER

During an active hypothermia alert in Washington, DC, individuals experiencing homelessness can access several life-saving resources. The Department of Human Services (DHS) activates additional shelter capacity and outreach efforts when temperatures drop below freezing. Anyone in need can call the Shelter Hotline at 202-399-7093 or 311 for transportation to a warm shelter. The United Planning Organization (UPO) deploys outreach vans throughout the city to provide transportation, blankets, and warm clothing.
